4. Notice of Anticipated Section 206 Filing Regarding Operating Agreement Language on Designated Entity Agreements and Notice of Consultation to the Members Committee Related to a Possible Section 205 Filing (11:45-12:10)

Pauline Foley will provide notice regarding an anticipated Section 206 filing regarding OA language on Designated Entity Agreements and notice of consultation related to a possible Section 205 filing:

PJM anticipates making a filing pursuant to Section 206 of the Federal Power Act asserting that the Operating Agreement is unjust and unreasonable as it relates to the implementation of Designated Entity Agreements. The specific course of action depends in part on the resolution of the related Problem Statement/Issue Charges at the July 27, 2022 MRC. PJM does not anticipate proposing a replacement rate at the time of filing.

In accordance with Tariff, section 9.2(b) and the Consolidated Transmission Owners Agreement, section 7.5.1(ii), PJM hereby provides notice of consultation to the Members Committee preceding a potential filing pursuant to Section 205 of the Federal Power Act to revise the *pro forma* Designated Entity Agreement set forth in Tariff, Attachment KK.

Code of Conduct:



Asking A Question

- Dialing *1 enters you into the question queue; the three dial tones are an auditory indication that you have successfully been placed in the queue.
