FTR Center to replace eFTR in 2Q 2016

eFTR is the next PJM Tool to be updated to the new PJM technology standard. FTR Center, the eFTR replacement will go live in 2Q 2016. FTR Center will be available 1Q 2016 for testing in PJM's Sandbox environment. While no functionality or business rules have changed in the development of FTR Center, PJM's new security controls will impact participants implementing browserless communications in FTR Center. After a period of parallel operations, eFTR will be officially retired. The exact date for the 1Q2016 FTR Center demonstration, supporting documentation availability, and the eFTR retirement date will be communicated later.
