Re: Support for Price Responsive Demand

Dear Mr. Schneider:

On November 12, 2010, the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) sent a letter to Ed Tatum, Chairman of PJM's Members Committee (MC), expressing PUCO's support of "improvements in PJM's electricity markets to better ensure reasonable prices consistent with maintaining system reliability." Subsequently, the Delaware Public Service Commission, the District of Columbia Public Service Commission, the Michigan Public Service Commission, and the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission separately expressed support for the PUCO letter.

As you are aware, the proposed PRD item failed to receive a majority vote at the PJM Markets and Reliability Committee (MRC) meeting on November 17, 2010, and was not on the agenda for the PJM MC meeting on November 18, 2010. Notwithstanding the MRC result, the OPSI Board of Directors supports the PUCO position<sup>1</sup> and urges the PJM Board of Managers to take independent action consistent with the PUCO position by making an appropriate filing at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.
