**Re: Incorporation of Advanced High Voltage Direct Current Technology
Into Mid-Atlantic Power Pathway Project**

Dear Board of Managers:

PSE&G is writing to voice its continued support of the proposed PHI Mid-Atlantic Power Pathway ("MAPP") project as a vital and necessary baseline project approved by FERC in PJM's 2007 RTEP.¹

PSE&G strongly agrees with PHI that the MAPP project, when considered in conjunction with other large scale transmission projects, such as the PSE&G/PPL Susquehanna to Roseland 500kV transmission project, will ensure that the transmission needs of the PJM region, including New Jersey, are met safely and reliably.

As described more fully in the June 30, 2008 letter submitted to you by William Gausman, PSE&G agrees that while additional study is certainly important, any further additional review should be completed as expeditiously as possible in order to ensure that MAPP project construction proceeds efficiently.

As PJM enters this critical period of vital and necessary transmission expansion, it remains central to the success of the contemplated large-scale transmission projects and


