ERRATA FILING

Dear Ms. Salas:

On October 6, 2006, pursuant to Section 205 of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 824d, and Part 35 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's ("Commission") regulations, PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. ("PJM") submitted for filing proposed revisions to PJM's Open Access Transmission Tariff ("PJM Tariff") to amend the timing requirements for Short Term Firm Transmission Service, Non-Firm Transmission Service and Secondary Network Service requests (the "October 6 Filing"). The Tariff revisions are proposed in conjunction with an effort to align PJM's and the Midwest Independent System Operator's ("Midwest ISO") OASIS transmission service products as a joint and common market ("JCM") initiative.¹ PJM requested an effective date of December 6, 2006.

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE ERRATA FILING

In the October 6 Filing, PJM proposed to revise Sections 17.8, 17.9, 18.3, 18.4 and 28.4 of the PJM Tariff to amend the timing requirements for Short Term Firm Transmission Service, Non-Firm Transmission Service and Secondary Network Service requests and align PJM's and the Midwest ISO's OASIS products as a result of the JCM initiatives directed by the Commission. These changes revise the transmission service timing requirements for the "no earlier than," "no later than", "determine capacity available," and "customer response" provisions in Parts II and III of the PJM Tariff.

While the proposed PJM Tariff revisions filed on October 6, 2006, included each and every one of these requirements in section 18.3 for Non-Firm Transmission Service requests and by reference for Secondary Service under section 28.4 of the PJM Tariff, the "no later than" requirement revisions for Short Term Firm Service requests under section 17.8 of the PJM Tariff was omitted due to an administrative oversight. As a result, PJM now amends the October 6 Filing and hereby files a revised Tariff sheet revising section 17.8 of the PJM Tariff to include the "no later than" timing requirements for Short Term Firm Transmission Service requests.

While the proposed redline Tariff revisions attached to the October 6 Filing inadvertently omitted the "no later than" requirements from Section 17.8 of the PJM Tariff, the presentations to PJM's stakeholders and members (more fully described in the October 6 Filing) included slides which set forth all the proposed PJM Tariff revisions pertaining to transmission service timing requirements including the "no later than" timing requirements for Short Term Firm Service. Thus, PJM's proposed

Access Transmission and Energy Markets Tariff ("Midwest ISO Tariff") in Docket No. ER06-1554-000 was approved by the Commission in an order issued on October 24, 2006.

Tariff revisions, including the amendment attached hereto, were reviewed and endorsed by the PJM Members under the process more fully described in the October 6 Filing.²

II. EFFECTIVE DATE

The attached PJM Tariff sheets have an effective date of December 6, 2006, a date which is at least 60 days after the date of the October 6 Filing.

III. DOCUMENTS ENCLOSED

PJM encloses with this transmittal letter six copies of the revised PJM Tariff sheets and redlined versions of such sheets.


V. SERVICE

- 17.7 Extensions for Commencement of Service:** The Transmission Customer can obtain up to five (5) one-year extensions for the commencement of service. The Transmission Customer may postpone service by paying a non-refundable annual reservation fee equal to one-month's charge for Firm Transmission Service for each year or fraction thereof. If during any extension for the commencement of service an Eligible Customer submits a Completed Application for Firm Transmission Service, and such request can be satisfied only by releasing all or part of the Transmission Customer's Reserved Capacity, the original Reserved Capacity will be released unless the following condition is satisfied. Within thirty (30) days, the original Transmission Customer agrees to pay the Firm Point-To-Point transmission rate for its Reserved Capacity concurrent with the new Service Commencement Date. In the event the Transmission Customer elects to release the Reserved Capacity, the reservation fees or portions thereof previously paid will be forfeited.
- 17.8 Reservation of Short-Term Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service:** Requests for monthly service shall be submitted no earlier than 12:00 a.m. EPT of the first calendar day of the month, which is seventeen (17) months before the date service is requested to commence; requests for weekly service shall be submitted no earlier than 12:00 a.m. EPT of the day, which is fourteen (14) days before the date service is to commence; and requests for daily service shall be submitted no earlier than 12:00 a.m. EPT of the day, which is seven (7) days before the date service is to commence. Requests for monthly service shall be submitted no later than 12:00 a.m. EPT of the date which is fourteen (14) days before service is to commence; requests for weekly service shall be submitted no later than 12:00 a.m. EPT of the date which is than seven (7) days before the service is to commence; and requests for daily service shall be submitted no later than 2:00 p.m. EPT the day before service is to commence. All requests received during the first thirty (30) minutes following the above-specified times shall be deemed to have been received simultaneously. Designations of new Network Resources under section 30.2 that will use interface capacity and that are for a period of less than one year will be processed together with, and in the same manner as, requests for Short-Term Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service.
- 17.9 Increases in Transmission Capability for Short-Term Transmission Service:** Each hour, the Transmission Provider shall post on the Transmission Provider's OASIS, the capability of the Transmission System then available to accommodate firm Transmission Service and Network Integration Service for each of the following seventeen (17) months. Reservations with respect to any increases in

transmission capability reflected in such posting may be made commencing at the time of posting. All requests for monthly Short-Term Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service and monthly designation pursuant to section 30.2 of a new Network Resource that will use interface capacity received during the first thirty (30) minutes after each posting shall be deemed to have been submitted simultaneously. The Transmission Provider shall respond to the requests no later than seven (7) business days from the time of request for monthly service and no later than two (2) business days from the time of the request for weekly service. The Transmission Provider shall respond to requests within four (4) normal business hours of receipt for daily service if feasible.

17.7 Extensions for Commencement of Service: The Transmission Customer can obtain up to five (5) one-year extensions for the commencement of service. The Transmission Customer may postpone service by paying a non-refundable annual reservation fee equal to one-month's charge for Firm Transmission Service for each year or fraction thereof. If during any extension for the commencement of service an Eligible Customer submits a Completed Application for Firm Transmission Service, and such request can be satisfied only by releasing all or part of the Transmission Customer's Reserved Capacity, the original Reserved Capacity will be released unless the following condition is satisfied. Within thirty (30) days, the original Transmission Customer agrees to pay the Firm Point-To-Point transmission rate for its Reserved Capacity concurrent with the new Service Commencement Date. In the event the Transmission Customer elects to release the Reserved Capacity, the reservation fees or portions thereof previously paid will be forfeited.

17.8 Reservation of Short-Term Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service: Requests for monthly service shall be submitted no earlier than 2:00 p.m. on the ~~first business day of the month that is 12:00 a.m. EPT of the first calendar day of the month, which is seventeen (17) months before the date month for which~~ service is requested to commence and prior to 2:00 p.m. on the day that is ~~fourteen (14) days before the month for which service is requested;~~ requests for weekly service shall be submitted no earlier than 2:00 p.m. on the ~~Monday that is 12:00 a.m. EPT of the day, which is fourteen (14) days before the date Monday on~~ which service is to commence and prior to 2:00 p.m. on the ~~Monday that is seven (7) days before the Monday on which service is to commence;~~ and requests for daily service shall be submitted no earlier than 2:00 p.m. on the ~~day that is the third (3rd) business day before service is scheduled to commence and prior to 12:00 noon on the day that is the first (1st) business day 12:00 a.m. EPT of the day, which is seven (7) days before the date service is to commence. 17.9 Increases in Transmission Capability for Short-Term Transmission Service: Each hour, the Transmission Provider shall post on the Transmission Provider's OASIS, the capability of the Transmission System then available to accommodate firm Transmission Service and Network Integration Service for each of the following seventeen (17) months. Reservations with respect to any increases in

transmission capability reflected in such posting may be made commencing at the time of posting. All requests for monthly Short-Term Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service and monthly designation pursuant to section 30.2 of a new Network Resource that will use interface capacity received during the first thirty (30) minutes after each posting shall be deemed to have been submitted simultaneously. The Transmission Provider shall respond to the requests no later than ~~4:00 p.m. the first business day following the request~~ seven (7) business days from the time of request for monthly service and no later than two (2) business days from the time of the request for weekly service. The Transmission Provider shall respond to requests within four (4) normal business hours of receipt for daily service if feasible.
