

- Pre-registration of a site is required to enable submission of an “Existing” Demand Resource in an RPM auction
  - Ensure sites will be available during the DY
  - Properly determine credit requirements
  - Only currently registered sites can be considered “existing”
- How does a CSP pre-register sites?

## Register (for 11/12) and Select (for 14/15)

1. CSP registers sites in PJM's ILR/DR program (via eLRS) for the upcoming DY (2011/2012):
  - Confirmed status by April 11, 2011
  - PJM will supply CSPs with a list of their Confirmed registrations by April 13, 2011
2. CSP selects those sites that will reduce load in 2014/15 DY and be the basis of their Existing Demand Resource offer into the 2014/2015 BRA
  - Selection submitted to PJM by COB April 20, 2011

**ILR/DR Registration must be in Confirmed status by April 11, 2011**

- CSP commits that registered end use customer site will have load reduction capability and will register as DR in the 14/15 DY
- CSP will select sites from their list and return to PJM by COB April 20, 2011
