Summary of the SIS Meeting for June 2011 OC Meeting

1. PJMNET LINK OUTAGE REPORT

Mr. Rich Glaum provided the link outage report for April 2011. Mr. Glaum highlighted several items in the report. On April 2nd, Baltimore Company had an outage caused by complications with creating a new network. The PJM reporting system had issues and reported incorrect outages starting April 14. On the 22nd, PJM had an issue with a corrupted Oracle database. PJM failed over to the Backup Control Center for approximately 30 minutes while the Oracle database was repaired. The actual outage lasted for approximately seven to ten minutes. An issue was noted on April 30, when EME was down for 226 minutes due an issue with an UPS.

There was a discussion around the link outage and outage e-mail lists. The concern is that marketers may be getting information about outages that could be used to game the markets. PJM will continue to discuss this internally while bearing in mind potential impacts to all members. Transmission owners will be notified of all scheduled outages. Generation owners need to be notified of scheduled outages at PJM.

2. PJM'S NEW EMS (AC²) UPDATE

Mr. John Collier provided an update on the AC² project, focusing on SOW#3 (EMS). Mr. Collier announced that PJM is ready for parallel operations. These will be a series of tests including simulating a catastrophic failure of the AC² EMS, a simulation of market processes, a switchover



test, a system performance test, and an integration production simulation. This last test includes a stability test and is scheduled for 21 days beginning on July 18th.

There was some discussion around checking EMS output data sent to Member Companies. Mr. Graff stated that PJM is continuing to discuss internally how we will be handling mock migrations and what involvement Member Companies will have in them.

In response to a question, Mr. Graff stated that data pumps are sending information from the production Market System to the AC² market system. A member requested an explanation concerning how PJM Members could test the new Markets servers. Mr. Graff said he would investigate.

3. PJM OPERATIONS, EDART AND ESUITE

Mr. Jerry Whooley reviewed the status of the eSuite applications. Most of the activity is for ATSI integration. Changes to eData and eDataFeed are being implemented. The first changes that will allow users to view ATSI Day Ahead LMPs will be implemented on Tuesday May 31st.

There was a minor change to eDART on May 11th. ATSI will be added as a new control zone on May 24th.

4. COMMUNICATION & SYSTEMS ISSUES

Mr. Graff led the discussion on communication and system issues. No issues came up.
