



PJM Interconnection
SIS Summary for the January 2012 OC Meeting
955 Jefferson Avenue
Norristown, PA
January 10, 2012

1. DUKE INTEGRATION

Mr. Dave Souder provided an update on the Duke Energy integration. Duke Energy is in five states; the PJM integration covers those portions in Ohio and Kentucky. The integration will be taking place at 00:00 on January 1, 2012. Mr. Souder stated the territory covered includes ~5600 MW of load and ~5100 MW of generation. This will result in PJM load increasing by approximately 3.5%.

PJM has passed the integration plan through NERC, RFC, and SERC. Mr. Souder discussed the preparations including coordination calls with MISO and Duke. The relevant manuals have been updated and posted on the PJM web site. Mock migrations were executed on November 30th and December 7th.

PJM will open up a WebEx session at 21:00 on December 31st. The majority of integration activities are scheduled to occur between 21:00 December 31st and 01:00 January 1st.

2. PJMNET LINK OUTAGE REPORT

Mr. Ron Graff reviewed the report. The report is created by the old C1 EMS and the reporting system is not yet available in the AC² system. Therefore, there is no data after PJM cut over to AC². Plans are to use the PI system to capture and codify the data generated, but some of the



definitions need to be re-examined. Mr. Bob Green stated that unless there's a real failure, the report may not add much value. This opinion was seconded by various members (Mr. Ron Allen). SIS decided the EMS Data Link Outage Report will be limited to only major outages and issues.

3. ESUITE STATUS REPORT

Mr. Ron DeLoach reviewed the presentation. A lot of work was done on eData to support the DUKE Ohio/Kentucky integration. Day Ahead Demand and LMPs should be available at 16:00 on New Years Eve. Some issues were noted after AC² migration. OASIS is working on Duke integration as well. eDART will have a new release on December 14th. The NERC-TADS report did not make the 12/14/2011 implementation due to additional NERC-TADS reporting requirements. Notification will be sent out when additional requirements are implemented. The TERM report was enhanced to handle increased number of bulk uploads. There were some MKT changes, and some eSuite changes on the backend with no impact to members.

4. COMMUNICATION & SYSTEMS ISSUES

Mr. Graff commented that the SIS will be meeting in the new CTC (Conference and Training Center) in early 2012. Also there will be a new procedure to access to the secure area of the SIS web site.
