

- Pre-registration of a sites is required to enable submission of an “Existing” Demand Resource in an RPM auction
 - Ensure sites will be available during the DY
 - Properly determine credit requirements
 - Only currently registered sites can be considered “existing”
- How does a CSP pre-register sites?

Register (for 10/11) and Select (for 13/14)

1. CSP registers sites in PJM's ILR/DR program (via eLRS) for the upcoming DY (2010/2011):
 - Confirmed status by April 12, 2010
 - PJM will supply CSPs with a list of their Confirmed registrations by April 14, 2010

2. CSP selects those sites that will reduce load in 2013/14 DY and be the basis of their Existing Demand Resource offer into the 2013/2014 BRA
 - Selection submitted to PJM by COB April 21, 2010

ILR/DR Registration must be in Confirmed status by April 12, 2010

- CSP commits that registered end use customer site will have load reduction capability and will register as DR in the 13/14 DY
- CSP will select sites from their list and return to PJM by COB April 21, 2010
 - Return spreadsheet to: dsr_ops@pjm.com
- DSR Ops will compile responses by CSP and Zone and forward to RPM Group
- CSP contacts RPM Group via rpm_hotline@pjm.com to offer Existing Demand Resource into 2013/14 BRA
