Interconnection Process Reform

Interconnection New Service requests have drastically increased over the past few years. The Interconnection Process Reform Task Force (IPRTF) will discuss challenges related to the interconnection process and look for opportunities to improve the process via the Consensus Based Issue Resolution (CBIR) process.

Problem Statement

Issue Status

The IPRTF is working on solution packages for a new interconnection process and solution packages to determine how PJM will transition to a new process.

Target Completion

The IPRTF is expected to be completed in the first quarter of 2022.

Progress Update

There have been four IPRTF meetings (November 4, 18, 23, and 30), since the last webinar.

All of the meetings have been focused on finalizing the packages related to the new interconnection process, and packages related to how PJM will transition to a new interconnection process.

After the November 30 meeting, a poll will be issued to determine the amount of support for all packages. The poll results will be reviewed at the December 7 IPRTF meeting.

The task force is striving to bring packages for a first read at the December 14, 2021 Planning Committee meeting.

Action Requested

Ensure your company has representation at the remaining IPRTF meetings. After endorsement at the Planning Committee (PC), there will be two IPRTF meetings to review OATT language updates before bringing the PC-sponsored packages to the Markets and Reliability Committee for a first read.
