NOTICE OF EXTENSION OF TIME

(April 29, 2026)

On April 3, 2026, PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. (PJM) filed a motion to extend the deadline specified for certain compliance directives in the Commission’s March 6, 2026 order in this proceeding.<sup>1</sup> Specifically, PJM seeks to extend the time allowed to refile the historical versions of Schedule 12 of the PJM Open Access Transmission Tariff effective as of June 18, 2015 and “to recalculate the cost allocations in Schedule 12 and correct the billing (with interest calculated pursuant to section 35.19(a) of the Commission regulations) within 90 days of the date of this order for all projects back to June 18, 2015” and “to make cleanup filings through eTariff to correct the cost allocations for each cost allocation.”<sup>2</sup> PJM states good cause exists to grant an extension of time

because it will have to expend substantial time and resources to ensure cost responsibility is accurately recalculated. On April 8, 2026, the Long Island Power Authority and Neptune Regional Transmission System, LLC, and the New York Entities<sup>3</sup> filed motions opposing PJM's motion for extension of time. On April 14, 2026, PJM filed a motion for leave to answer and answer. On April 20, 2026, the Public Service Electric and Gas Company filed a motion for leave to answer and answer partially opposing PJM's motion for extension of time. On April 22, 2026, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities and the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel filed an out-of-time answer opposing PJM's motion for extension of time.

Upon consideration, the deadline for PJM "to recalculate the cost allocations in Schedule 12 and correct the billing (with interest calculated pursuant to section 35.19(a) of the Commission regulations) within 90 days of the date of this order for all projects back to June 18, 2015," "to make cleanup filings through eTariff to correct the cost allocations for each cost allocation," and to refile revised, historical versions of Schedule 12 of the Tariff is hereby extended until further order of the Commission. PJM must comply with all other directives of the March 6 Order, including revising Section 12 to eliminate the *de minimis* threshold exemption prospectively by filing a revised version of the currently effective Schedule 12.
