- Reasons FERC requests this data
 - To make it available to industry participants to perform analysis to confirm results determined by reliability studies
- Applicable to Transmitting Utilities
- PJM gathers and submits this filing as a service to PJM Transmission Owners
- PJM interacts with FERC staff if there are questions
- Portions are considered Critical Energy Infrastructure Information (CEII)



2024 FERC Form 715

- No changes to the request this year
- Due March 25, 2025
- All TOs must Supply a Part 1 identifying a Certifying Official and a Contact
- PJM will supply base cases and Reports
- If other Part submittals have not changed, we can send in previous submittals
- Use the email feature of Secure Share to submit

FERC Form No. 715

FERC has determined that to satisfy section 213(b) of the Federal Power Act, potential customers must be able to reasonably anticipate the outcome of technical studies a transmitting utility would perform that assess the availability of transmission capacity to satisfy a request for transmission service. Therefore, each utility or its designated agent must submit an annual report. PJM reports this information to FERC on behalf of all of its transmission owners.
