

# PRTMD Workshop Next Steps

- Achieve high level of engagement for sharing of ideas during the meetings, post-meeting issuance of polls, collecting written feedback.
- Discuss and obtain feedback and additional points of view from all stakeholders on:
  - The diagnosis (which may include expanding/modifying based on push back or alternative views)
  - The foundational questions raised in the paper
  - The stated paths and trade offs
  - Whether there are other paths we should explore and why

- Gain an understanding of which path or paths the stakeholders seek to move forward on in what order or time frame?
- That the resulting stakeholder process is targeted.

- Workshop sessions to date:
  - June 12 – PJM overview of the paper and open discussion and Q&A
  - July 15 - five individual speakers and two panels on topics including the diagnosis/root causes, long-term contracting, demand side participation and alternative paths
  - July 29 - six individual speakers on topics including the root causes, investment climate, paths to consider
- Two meetings currently scheduled in August will be canceled

- Instead, PJM is asking for written papers to inform what the ultimate scope and process will be employed to develop market design rules
- Papers must cover at least the following areas (subject to final wording when we send a written communication):
  - The most pressing issues that need to be addressed and any timing considerations for addressing these issues
  - The path(s) (either as described in the PJM paper or alternative paths) that your organization believes PJM should pursue and why
  - Additional or supplemental path(s) that you recommend States explore to support long-term market durability and/or customer cost stability
  - Areas that should remain out of scope in these stakeholder discussions and why it is appropriate to narrow the scope of work accordingly
  - The process that your organization would recommend be used to structure the stakeholder engagement
  - Any education or analysis that you would request from PJM to support the upcoming stakeholder engagement

- Due to PJM by August 30
- Posted with attribution
- PJM envisions holding a workshop session (potentially 2-day) in late September or early October (date TBD) to discuss the papers and allow for open Q&A.
- Again, the purpose of the papers is to inform the states, PJM leadership and the PJM Board in determining the scope and process for a future stakeholder process to develop market design rules.

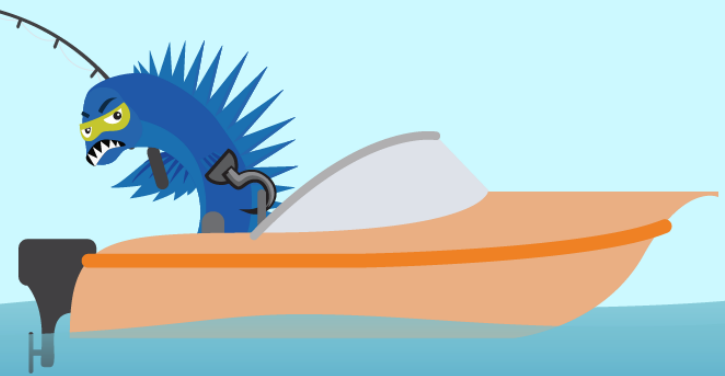
