Dear Stakeholders,

Thank you for your correspondence dated March 31, 2023, concerning the Critical Issue Fast Path (CIFP) and Resource Adequacy (RA). We appreciate you sharing the guiding principles around which your organizations have aligned as you consider the important issues we face in the energy transition.

Many of the issues you identified have been the subject of discussion in the Resource Adequacy Senior Task Force and will continue to be discussed in the CIFP-RA. We welcome all feedback during the CIFP-RA; we look forward to your engagement as we continue to refine PJM's initial proposal and consider other interested stakeholders' proposals as well.

Thank you for sharing your thoughts on gas-electric coordination as well. In our letter initiating the CIFP, the PJM Board of Managers (Board) acknowledged that "[w]hile resource adequacy is a critical component of reliability, the Board believes that there may be other areas of PJM's rules and process that would benefit from review and enhancement to ensure they are working efficiently to maintain reliability at the lowest reasonable cost." Gas-electric coordination is one such issue. In fact, at the April 18, 2023 Electric Gas Coordination Senior Task Force, there were two solution proposals shared for incremental reforms in this area and we anticipate proposed reforms will come to vote in the near term. Additionally, we note your encouragement for PJM to engage at a national level on policies that improve gas-electric coordination. We will look for opportunities where it will be productive for us to do so.

Given PJM's Energy Transition analyses including our recent Energy Transition in PJM: Resource Retirements, Replacement and Risk report, and as we continue to delve in to the Winter Storm Elliott event analysis, we agree that there are additional opportunities to explore solutions beyond the scope of the capacity market. We anticipate sharing our thoughts on those items over the coming months and will appreciate your engagement in those discussions as well.
