Proposal

Allow PJM to record meetings and post the recordings on PJM.com for MyPJM account holders to access What the Proposal <u>Is Not</u>

- The proposal would not apply to the Liaison Committee or other meetings limited to a select group of Members or stakeholders
- The proposal would not change the current prohibition on stakeholders (or others) creating their own audio, visual, or online recordings of meetings
- The proposal would not change the current requirement that speakers at meetings cannot be quoted in the media without explicit permission

Stakeholder Benefits of Recording Meetings Recording meetings and posting the recordings on PJM.com would allow for a more efficient and informed stakeholder process

- Allow stakeholders to listen to meetings they could not attend and stay up-todate
- Allow stakeholders to review portions of meetings they attended but wish for additional review

Ensuring Stakeholder Protection

Policy should not inhibit discussion or negotiation of proposals critical to the stakeholder process

Access to recordings would be limited to MyPJM account holders

Recording use would be limited to stakeholder purposes (i.e., not future litigation)

Ensuring Stakeholder Protection

- Stakeholders could affirmatively request specific meetings not be recorded
- PJM would keep a recording "check out" list of MyPJM account holders who have accessed a recording in keeping with existing Code of Conduct guidelines
- Meetings would be removed from PJM.com after the next meeting of the same committee or task force
