Alternative CBL process will be same as defined in tariff for economic registrations (must run RRMSE test). If location has economic registration then economic registration cbl will be used unless it is maximum baseload method which will use default CBL. This is same proposal previously approved by DRS for emergency energy M&V before it was postponed due to EPSA case. No stakeholders at DRS meeting opposed this proposal or voiced concerns about this proposal.
