 - PJM package 2 failed
- Packages similar on enhanced process transparency
 - Enhanced proposal submittal template
 - End of RTEP evaluation summary
 - Designated Entity cost containment notification requirement



Jpjm

- Includes process transparency items
 - Implementation timing target the upcoming 2018/2019 long term proposal window in November
- Cost containment evaluation focused on construction cost only
 - PJM will consider cost commitment on construction cost only
 - PJM determines the reasonableness of cost estimates for construction cost only and uses the cost estimate it determines appropriate based on project risks and feasibility




PJM Package 2

- Similar to package 1, includes the transparency items
 - Implementation timing target the upcoming 2018/2019 long term proposal window in November
- Cost containment evaluation
 - PJM can evaluate any cost commitment offered, and where necessary, evaluate revenue requirement impacts based on cost commitment for selected variable inputs to represent a reasonable range of possible outcomes
 - Evaluate risk of construction cost exceeding the estimate based upon specific project risk factors
 - Commit PJM to a feasibility and resource study to perform the evaluation in a timely fashion of any cost commitment of competitive projects
 - Study timing target recommendations for implementation by the 2019 reliability window



- PJM will assess the resources, costs and impacts to include a revenue requirement analysis in a reliability planning process based on the sponsorship model
 - PJM will present its findings to the Planning Committee by the 2019 reliability window
 - PJM can engage a third party consultant to provide additional resources and expertise to conduct the feasibility and resource study
 - The next slide represents a conceptual schedule with concurrent analysis completing within the available evaluation time

Transmission Planning Process Timeline Evaluation – Conceptual Optimized Schedule






Package 2 - Evaluation Feasibility and Resource Study

- Proposed study areas
 - Engage consultants prior to the close of the proposal window
 - After the window closes
 - Leverage technology to shorten durations on critical path activities
 - Investigate the use of Planning Community, TEAC webcasts and other methods for more effectively communicating with stakeholders
 - Mitigate schedule risks for critical path items
 - Evaluate PJM resources
 - Develop construct to consider cost containment analysis on variations of ROE, capital cost, and equity structure inputs



Current Transmission Planning Process Timeline






Transmission Planning Process Timeline Evaluation - Existing Process

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Package 2 - Evaluation Feasibility and Resource Study

- Prior to window close
 - Preliminary scoping of consultant work
 - Retain consultants
- After the window closes
 - Triage and processing of project proposal submittals
 - Stakeholder feedback
 - Mitigate schedule risks for critical path items
 - Triage
 - Constructability analysis
 - Data collection
 - PJM resources
- Cost containment analysis scenarios performed for variations of ROE, capital cost, and equity structure inputs
