

On June 10, 2019, in Docket No. ER19-2105-000, PJM submitted a filing on behalf of the PJM Transmission Owners proposing revisions to the PJM Tariff to revise the rates for Point-to-Point Transmission Service to the Border of PJM and Network Integration Transmission Service for Non-Zone Network Load. The proposed revisions will replace the existing stated rates for both Point-to-Point Transmission Service to the Border of PJM and Network Integration Transmission Service (“NITS”) for Non-Zone Network Load with a methodology for updating these rates on an annual basis beginning with the calendar year 2020. The current PJM discounted rate of \$0.67 per MWh for non-firm transmission service is not impacted by this change.

The Commission issued an order on November 5, 2019, accepting the proposed tariff revisions, effective January 1, 2020, subject to refund and suspending the PJM Transmission Owners’ proposed Border Rate Filing, establishing hearing and settlement procedures in the docket.

PJM presented a first read of revisions to Manual 27: Open Access Transmission Tariff Accounting that will reflect FERC’s recent order on border rate calculations (ER19-2105) at the November 13, 2019 MIC meeting.

PJM is calculating the new rates and will post the rates and all supporting information on the Billing, Settlements, & Credit page on [pjm.com](https://www.pjm.com/markets-and-operations/billing-settlements-and-credit.aspx), <https://www.pjm.com/markets-and-operations/billing-settlements-and-credit.aspx>, by December 1. PJM plans to begin using the new rates on January 1, 2020 unless hearing and settlement procedures are finalized before the end of the year and direct PJM to do otherwise. If the hearing and settlement procedures are finalized after the new rates go into effect, then PJM will issue any refunds required based on the final ruling. Refunds would go back to January 1, 2020.
