Coordination and Interconnection Agreement (CIA)

Purpose

- The purpose of the CIA is to create a bridge agreement to provide for coordination between the Designated Entity and existing Transmission Owners regarding the interconnection of an RTEP project prior to the Designated Entity executing the Consolidated Transmission Owners Agreement and initial energization.



Coordination and Interconnection Agreement (CIA)

- **Key Aspects of the CIA**
 - Formalizes coordination responsibilities between the TO and DE during the construction phase
 - Outage coordination to support DE construction
 - Includes a one line diagram to delineate facility ownership
 - Includes required electrical characteristics

- Questions raised by Stakeholders
 - Is a coordination agreement needed?
 - Is the coordination agreement required after a wires-to-wires Interconnection Agreement is in place?
 - If the Designated Entity is a party to the Consolidated Transmission Owners Agreement, is a CIA still required?

- OA and Tariff classify confidential information as any information labeled as such
- PJM concern – need to fulfill PJM obligations and ensure transparency under OA Schedule 6
